Firstly, I would like to welcome everyone back to school. Happy New Year!

You may be aware that the Government has launched a new national campaign to remind parents/carers of the importance of school attendance.

You will be hearing about it on tv, social media and hearing about it on the radio.

We regularly remind you about the importance of good punctuality and attendance and the negative impact poor attendance has on your child's educationa attainment and social and emotional development. In 2018/2019, just 40% of persistently absent (PA) children in KS2 achieved expected KS2 standards, compared with 84% of pupils who were regular attenders.
